## **Job possibilities**

After the successful completion of the course, our participants will work in enterprises/homes for geriatric care. They will find job opportunities in the field of patient care (nursing) and geriatric care, offered by public or private institutions, in facilities of assisted living, or as a self-employed person in a private home.

## **Educational aims**

The profession belongs to the category of assistant healthcare professions.

The successful attendance of our intensive training enables the participants to work in care facilities and nursing homes, as well as to look after older people in their own surroundings and to support them in coping with everyday tasks.

During the training the participants will learn the basics of geriatric care, they will be taught methods of communication and how to interact with people in need of care.

## Course contents

- Introduction in the general basics and chances of geriatric care (care for older people).
- Elderly care on the basis of respect and acceptance.
- Using appropriate utilities and aids. Training with wheel chairs.
- Learning specific caring tasks and acquiring the necessary competence for care giving activities.
- Conducting hygiene and disinfection measurements.
- Preventative measures (prophylaxis) in different areas.
- Introduction into diseases and clinical pictures, especially
  - chronic problems
  - age-related problems and diseases
  - dementia
- Assessing the needs of those suffering from dementia and developing special care plans
- Providing crisis intervention and dealing with difficult situations and death.
- Identification of the resources and needs of the elderly and their family, in order to carry out professional and appropriate care plans and concepts
